Women's Coach's Report 2025

The QFAW program had great numbers and enthusiasm in the pre-season, from before Christmas right through to our first game in April, with club stalwarts Lizzie, Grace and Em regularly leading the various running, boxing, and fitness drills. The club retained a great core group of players that brought a lot of footballing experience and wisdom, with three players; Rhi Meehan, Dakodah Cott, and Amelia Weddell, playing their 50th game for the club this season.

We had a number of new players join the club too, with Zoe and Ruby both being scouted from Tasmanian leagues, Jorja and Mykaela recruited out of a soccer team playing as the left and right backs and thrown onto the half back flanks, Meg's potential identified while camp drafting at the Goondiwindi rodeo, Tara transitioning from darts, Ren and Kirsty bringing their touch footy experience, Catrina with a Gaelic background, and Ash and Jordan coming across from other footy clubs. Amelia Weddell's consistent, determined and lead by example approach in training lead us to naming her as the Captain, with the support of strong and reliable Vice Captains including Erin, Elvina, Dakodah, Lizzie and Rhi.

The season started with tough clashes against Kedron, Caloundra, and Redcliffe while the group were still gelling together and developing their playing style. The team really hit a turning point when we went out on a very wet, cold and miserable day to play ladder leaders Pine Rivers. Despite coming away with a loss, Mayne displayed a newfound level of fight and determination to keep Pine Rivers to a narrow three goal margin, which instilled a level of confidence in the group that they could match it with the best in the competition. A special mention to full back Amber who kept the league's leading goal kicker scoreless on the day.

In the back half of the season the ball movement improved remarkably, with clean chains of play often starting from Elvina and the Rolls sisters at half back, transitioning through the silky skills of key midfielders Zoe, Rhi, Mel, Millie, and Amelia, finding their way to Erin, Dakodah and Tara deep in the forward line. This translated to the scoreboard, with Mayne competing every week, pushing the opposition, but unfortunately recording five losses over the period where we went down by less than a goal.

In the final round of the season Mayne went up to Palmwoods chasing the first win of the year, with opponents the Hinterland Blues in the same position. The game was characterised by a tough battle in the midfield with superb ruck work from Dakodah and inside mid craft from Zoe. The back line were exceptional at intercepting the ball and shutting down the Hinterland attack. Mayne got into a rhythm in the third quarter inspired by a stirring half time speech from Angus Shaw, pulling away to finish the game up by a seven goal margin. The Mayne women have been determined all year and the last round of the season was a great team effort, a well-deserved win, and a magnificent belting out of Tigerland followed by coach Kyle Henry leading the group in a rendition of Pink Pony Club.

Thank you to Angus Shaw, Kyle Henry and Sean Doolan for coaching all year - the playing group is extremely fortunate to have access to your expert footballing knowledge. We are very grateful to Sasha Cochrane for running a great S&C program, readying the playing group's fitness for a big season and always making it fun. Jo Price and Lizzie Delaney deserve my thanks for managing the team this year - you have both made it very easy for everyone else to focus on the playing and coaching.

Thank you to the Mayne QFAW #1 ticketholders; Glenda and Rod Barber - we appreciate your support every week, especially at the wet games when you bring your grippo. A special shout out to Erin Baker and Amelia Weddell for organising a number of off field events for the team. A big thanks also to all other volunteers who helped throughout the year including Uncle Carl, James Price, Dos, Corey Smith, Sam Pitman and Drew Merryfull.

Finally, I have really enjoyed the opportunity to coach the Mayne QFAW programme and I thank the club for the chance to get my AFL coaching career underway.
