Carl Herbert - Only a lightly framed player Carl was like a rubber man and super brave. A left footer from Aspley juniors, he oozed class, was a courageous mark and a beautiful kick. Recruited as a youngster to

Collingwood after playing well in the Mayne 1982 flag side he played 3 games for the Pies before heading to South Australia where he had a wonderful career playing 97 games in 5 years with West Adelaide. Returning home, he captained the club for 4 years and also won 4 best and fairests over the journey in 1982 (the premiership year) and again in 92, 93 and 94. Carl represented Queensland twice, was named at half forward in the Tiger Team of the Century and is a Life Member of the club.
