Hayden Fry at just seventeen was terrific in the ruck and around the ground as he put on a dominant display giving the Tigers plenty of new ball. Fry's little brother Tom wasn't about to be out done either as he also took on players well beyond his years to create havoc up and down his side of the ground.
